#### Our Goal's for Student Achievement

#### District Goals

The Board of Education sets goals for the entire district.







The district goals for 2023-2024:

- ➤ To increase the percentage of students in grades 3-12 meeting proficient or higher on the GMAS ELA EOC/EOG from 53% to 56% (ES), from 52% to 55% (MS), and from 59% to 62% (HS).
- ➤ To increase the percentage of students in grades 3- 12 meeting proficient or higher on the GMAS Math EOC/EOG from 59% to 62% (ES), from 47% to 50% (MS), from 50% to 53% (HS).

#### School Goals

David L. Rainer Elementary school will increase the percentage of students reading on grade level and problem solving in math by four percentage points as measured by Lexile scores and math proficiency on the Georgia Milestones End of Grades Assessment.

This year we will focus on vocabulary and writing across the curriculum in Reading and problem solving and fluency in math.

#### In the Classroom

The teachers in the classroom will work with students and their families to support students' success in reading and math. Some of our key connections with families will be:

- Host Collaborative Conferences throughout the year.

- Provide a list of titles on grade Level ranges.
- Provide guidance on math standards and tips for fluency.

#### At Home

David L. Rainer Elementary School parents joined staff to develop ideas about how families can support students' success in reading and math. Families may have other ideas to add to this list.

- Attend Collaborative Conferences.
- •Review vocabulary and sight words weekly.
- Ensure my child reads daily on their grade level Lexile ranges and ask questions.
- Practice number identification and fluency on subtraction, addition, multiplication, and division as appropriate.

**David Elementary School Students** joined staff and parents to develop ideas about how they can succeed in school and reach for their highest potential in math and reading. Students thought of the following ideas to make connections between learning at home and school:

- *Know my Lexile goal and share that with my family.*
- Read books in my range daily and answer comprehension questions provided by my school
- Share with my family what I am doing and learning in school.
